PGCD BOARD SET RULES HEARING FOR DECEMBER

The Panhandle Groundwater District's Board of Director's voted to set a Rules Public Hearing on **District Rule 3.3 (e) on December 7, 2021, at 9:00 a.m.**

The Board has been reviewing the District's Rules over the past several months and is committed to working with all water users as we move forward together. The main rule changes proposed for December 7 are moving from a 3 to a 4-year rolling average on production for compliance and adding clarifying statutory language from Chapter 36 of the Texas Water Code. TAX RATE UPDATE

During the August 18 Board Meeting, Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District's Board of Directors approved the 2021-2022 tax rate. As required, the District placed proper notices in newspapers and online. PGCD received no public comment regarding the tax rate.

Directors voted to keep the tax rate the same as last year at \$0.010200 per \$100 of taxable valuation. All funds will be used to fund the District's general operations.

AG LOANS AVAILABLE

Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District is accepting loan applications from District producers for center pivot sprinklers, drip irrigation systems, soil moisture probes, and other water-saving equipment. The loan is available to producers at an interest rate of 1.08 percent with an eight year payback term. Approximate funds available are \$1,000,000.
